

Wissnet was established 2010/2011 as an informal network of six Science shops, nostly from Easton they were connected to whole Germany and founded a German Living Know edge Website NGO's, Now wissnet is an established network with recurring conferences, an own website at connection between the members, online or in reality.

These projects are examples of those that have been realised:




Figure 1 - The circles of CERL (Community Engaged Research and Learn g)

Impacts of CESI's Research Shop Published i | JHEOE

An article written on the impact of CESI's Research Shop has been published in the June 2022 very of Higher Education Outreach and Engagement. Since 2009, the Community Engaged Scholarsh University of Guelph has operated a Science Shop (The Research Shop) where it carries out high engaged scholarship by training and employing graduate students to conduct community-engaged co-curricular activity.

This study investigates the first 9 years of the program to determine its impacts on community particles and suggest that the benefits experienced by both stakeholder groups are sirilar to those id literature on community-engaged research and Science Shops, with some additional findings unimodel. Overall, the research found that both community partners and students experience distinct challenges.
