- CBPR facilitates collaborative, equitable partnerships in all phases of the research.
■ *Facilita la colaboración equitativa e todas las fases de la investigación.*
- CBPR integrates and achieves a balance between research and action for the mutual benefit of all partners.
■ *Integra y crea un equilibrio entre la investigación y los beneficios mutuos de todas las partes.*
- CBPR recognizes community as a unit of identity.
■ *Reconocer a la comunidad como unidad de identidad.*
- CBPR builds on strengths and resources within the community.
■ *Fundamentado en las fortalezas y recursos como parte de la comunidad.*
- CBPR promotes co-learning and capacity building among all partners.
■ *Este procedimiento promueve aprendizaje mutuo y desarrolla capacidad entre todos los socios implicados.*
- CBPR involves a long-term process and commitment.
■ *Implica un proceso y un compromiso a largo plazo.*
- CBPR emphasizes local relevance of public health problems and ecological perspectives that recognize and attend to the multiple determinants of health and disease.
■ *Enfatiza la importancia de problemas de salud pública y un enfoque ecológicos en los determinantes de la salud y de la enfermedad.*
- CBPR disseminates findings and knowledge gained to all partners and involves all partners in the dissemination process.
■ *Disemina resultados a todos los socios e involucra a todos los socios en el proceso de la desiminación.*
- CBPR involves systems development through a cyclical and iterative process.
■ *Implica el desarrollo de sistemas a través de un proceso cíclico e iterativo.*
